## Palm Sunday (13 April)

Our journey begins as we travel with Christ, atop a donkey into Jerusalem. This is a kingly moment, but the king entering the city is sad, humble and there is an air of gloom.

### Palm Sunday Procession (13 April)

10am - Holy Communion - St. John Baptist Cockayne Hatley\*

We walk from St. Marys to the Salvation Army Chapel. Our walking is our telling of Christ's walk from trial to execution. Its also a witness to what we believe is 'really' happening in the story. What Jesus is really about in these sad and confusing events. The walk concludes with some refreshments and a service in the Salvation Army Chapel.

# Saturday Film: Remembering Jesus (19 April)


The day after Jesus' death, his friends likely gathered to remember him. In a similar way we come together to a watch a film of his life.

### **Easter Vigil**
